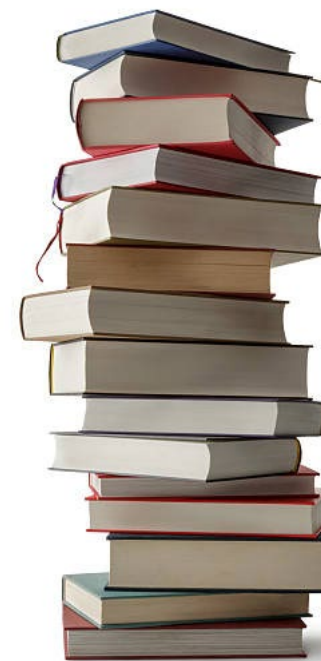
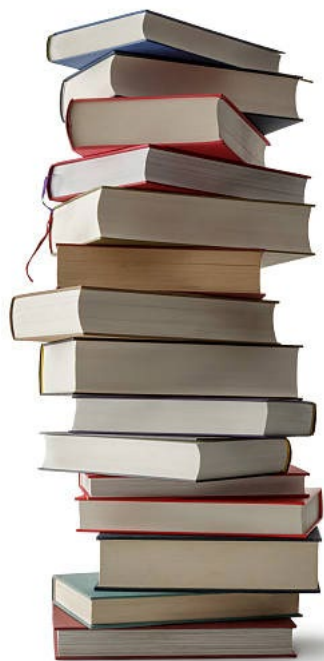
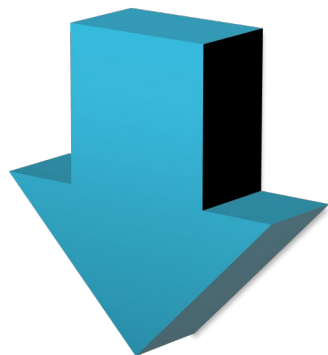





Accident Rates and Onboard Fatalities by Year

As I anticipated in an earlier letter, I wrote to [REDACTED] Accountable Manager, [REDACTED] about the letter you (and others) had received after submitting fatigue reports. His reply contained the following paragraph:

Safety is [REDACTED] number one priority and we have an exemplary 34-year record. As you are aware, [REDACTED] treats all safety reports with utmost importance. Our Safety Service Office reviews every ASR submitted at the Daily ASR Review Meeting and appropriate follow up action is taken. Regrettably, over the summer period we received a number of alleged fatigue reports which had no reasonable and/or operational basis and arose from duties that were well within our rostering and FTL limits. These appear to have been directly linked to an industrial relations agenda. You will understand that our Safety Reporting System must recognise the difference between genuine and bogus reports and respond appropriately.



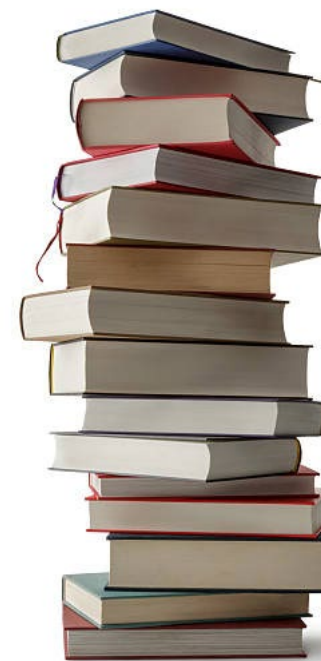
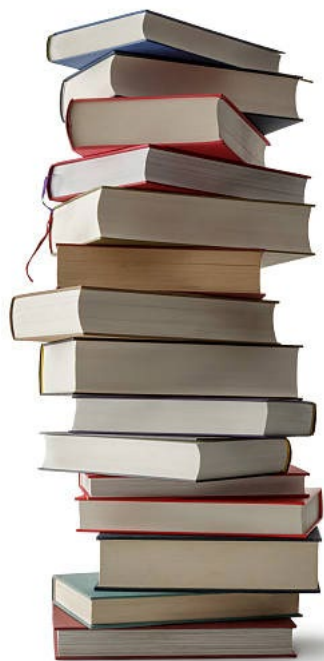
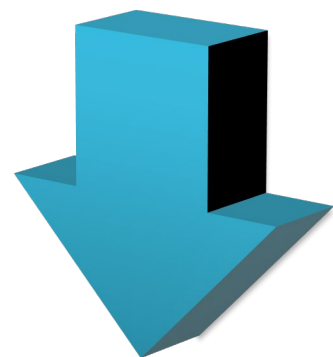


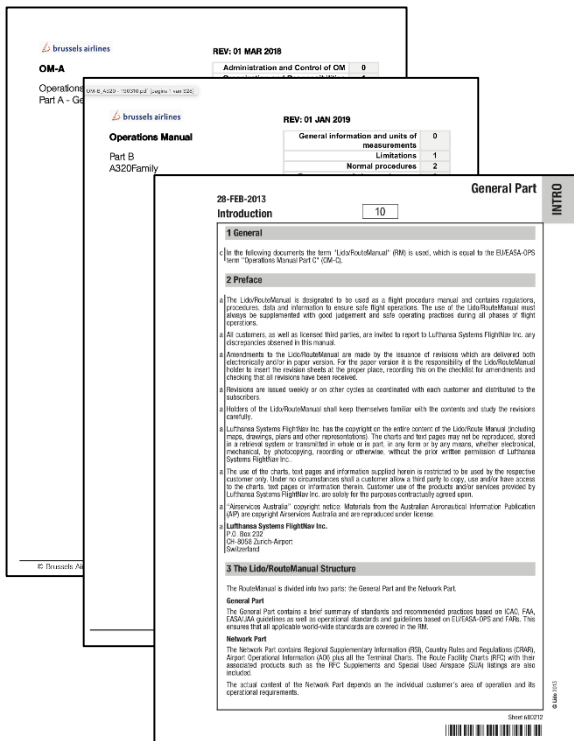
